Penney's words resonate most as we reflect on the achievement to date regarding FAFSA completion. The increasing cost of higher


education continues to make headlines along with the number of students, who for various reasons, fail to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), leaving free funds on the table each year. In an effort to pilot best practices aimed at increasing FAFSA completion rates, The Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance applied for a FAFSA Challenge Grant in cooperation with the following partners:

- Career Compass
- LELA
- Louisiana Board of Regents
- Louisiana Department of Education
- Baton Rouge Community College
- East Baton Rouge Parish School System

The grant was sponsored by the National College Access Network and funded by the Kresge Foundation. NCAN selected 22 U.S. cities to receive up to \$55,000 each to raise FAFSA completion rates by at least 5

percent for the graduating Class of 2017. Baton Rouge was selected as one of those cities. Here's how our team placed at the end of the competition.





Through song, poetry, and Wordplay, the FLY Tour educates students about financial literacy and financial responsibility as well as a variety of LOSFA-administered student financial assistance programs.

The FLY Tour is a dynamic theatrical presentation that uses poetry, music, and drama to communicate the importance of financial literacy and fiscal responsibility. The intent is to make students aware of how financial aid decisions made early in their lives can have a lasting impact on their futures. The production will also present information about support services available to students on college campuses and pre-college tasks that must be completed prior to the student's first day of classes.

The response to the FLY Tour has been so overwhelmingly positive that it is now an annual LOSFA event held on post-secondary education campuses across the state.

Louisiana GEAR UP Students from Florien High School visited Central Louisiana Technical Community College-Sabine Valley to take an informative and interactive campus tour. During the tour, the students learned about the institution's admissions and financial aid processes before taking an interactive tour of the technical education programs offered by CLTCC-Sabine Valley, including the Business Office Technology, Patient Care Technician, Welding Technology, and the Electrician Technology programs. As the students

learned about the different technical programs, they participated in hands-on activities that would be relevant to earning certifications in those programs. For example, students learned to administer CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) using training dummies while learning about the Patient Care Technician program. While discussing the Business Office Technology program, each student participated in a typing test as typing skills are vital to professions that students enter after completing the program.






