TOPS Initial Eligibility for 2012 Graduates

TOPS Initial Eligibility (IE) for the 2012 graduates for academic year 2012-2013 began on Thursday, June 7, 2012. Initial eligibility runs every Monday and Thursday. Although the Student Roster changes are only updated on Friday, the Louisiana Award System (LAS) provides students round-the-clock access to their individual data and schools have immediate access to the data for their student population.

As records for the 2012 high school graduates are processed, those who are determined eligible will appear on the Academic Year (AY) Student Roster as disposition 000 New Eligible. When postsecondary schools submit end of term grades, TOPS continuing student eligibility processes and the updated student status is reflected on the TOPS Student Roster as disposition 001 Approved Renewal. The initial 2013 AY Student Roster was made available to the schools in May.

Online START deposits now available

Online payment for START account deposits is now available on the START Saving Web site, www.startsaving.la.gov.

Account owners must log into their START account, select the "Deposit Forms" option from the menu and then select "Electronic Online Deposit". From here account owners can select the account(s) into which they want to make a deposit and indicate the amount they wish to deposit.

One deposit can be distributed among a maximum of five accounts. If an account owner has more than five accounts, he or she will have to log back into his or her START account and select the additional accounts in a second transaction.

When online payment is selected, the account owner will be transferred to a secure Web site operated by First Data Corporation, PayPoint. This organization was contracted by the state to support online payments.

On the PayPoint site, the account owner will see the LOSFA logo, the START title, a listing of a maximum of 5 accounts with the amount selected for deposit, and two payment options. The account owner can select to pay by electronic check or by credit card. The credit cards accepted are Mastercard and Discover. Visa will not be accepted at this time due to company restrictions on charging convenience fees that make recoupment of the transaction costs difficult to achieve.

The account owner will enter his or her financial data on the PayPoint secure Web site to complete the deposit transaction. LOSFA will not receive any credit card or checking account financial information from First Data.

A convenience fee will be charged to use the online payment process to cover the transaction costs and thus keep the START Savings Program free of administrative fees. The fee will be in addition to the amount of the deposit(s). The fee will be displayed prior to the account holder's final authorization of the payment.



Louisiana Connect Update

As of June 20, 2012, more than 20,000 people have signed onto Louisiana Connect and activated their accounts. Over 1,200 of those accounts belong to Professional School Counselors.

Lenders/Servicers - All tape filings will continue to be forwarded directly to Sallie Mae using the same contact information you are currently using. However, effective June 25th all manual LRA requests must be sent directly to SAC using the contact information listed above.

Failure to send your claims to one of the addresses listed above will result in delays in processing your claims.

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Initial eligibility (IE) determination for TOPS applicants begin when LOSFA receives the following: final grades and graduation certification from the high schools through the Louisiana Department of Education (LDE) Student Transcript System (STS); a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the TOPS Online Application; and official scores from ACT and/or SAT.

Special populations, such as home study, out-of-state, out-of-country, military, non-graduate, and returning student applicants also process on Monday and Thursday. Because these students process with alternate eligibility requirements, the student is responsible for ensuring that certain required documents, such as ACT and/or SAT scores, out-of-state and out-of-country final high school transcripts with graduation date, and completed TOPS Affidavit of Residency, are received timely by LOSFA. The TOPS IE requirements for special populations, along with the other initial and continuing eligibility requirements can be found on our Website, www.osfa.la.gov.

Students are encouraged to monitor their TOPS status via the LAS at www.osfa.la.gov. Additionally, students with an active account on the Louisiana Connect Portal are able to receive notifications once their TOPS status has been determined. TOPS award notification letters are mailed to newly eligible, reinstated, and ineligible students after the Monday and Thursday IE processing. GO Grant Allocations for 2012-2013

Board of Regents approves the following for the GO Grant for the 2012-2013 academic year:

- 1. With the exception of the change made to the eligibility requirement for students 25 years old or older (Student Financial Aid Bulletin S2012-03, dated March 20, 2012), the eligibility framework will remain the same as outlined in Student Financial Aid Bulletin S2010-04, dated July 6, 2010.
- 2. Annual award amounts for 2012-2013: \$1,000 full-time, \$500 half-time, \$250 less than half-time.
- 3. Institutions were given an annual allocation amount based on the same methodology used for 2010-2011 and 2011-2012.
- 4. The annual allocation will be used for fall, winter, and spring semesters/terms, with no plans to fund summer awards.
- 5. Due to legislative reporting requirements, it is necessary to continue the fall billing deadline of November 1, 2012 (fall billing corrections deadline, November 16) and a winter billing deadline of January 17, 2013 (winter billing corrections deadline, February 1). The fall and winter deadlines will also allow LOSFA and Board of Regents to better estimate funding availability for subsequent semesters/terms.
- 6. Late billings for fall, winter and spring semesters/terms will not be allowed. In the event of a reallocation of unused funds, the school(s) receiving the reallocated funding will be provided with a deadline to expend the reallocated dollars.
- 7. After the spring billing deadline, March 24, 2013, (spring billing corrections deadline, April 11), unused funds will be reallocated. Reallocations will be made to institutions to award to students enrolled in the fall and continued to spring or enrolled in the spring who were eligible for but did not receive a Go Grant because the institution used its full annual allocation.
- 8. Institutions should continue to make awards according to their defined priority process. As previously issued, it is the general philosophy of the Board of Regents that the grant is awarded to those students with the most need.

Important TOPS info

Effective immediately beginning with the 2011-12 academic year, the academic year includes summer sessions and intersessions for the TOPS 24 hour requirement only. Hours earned at any time from the fall semester/quarter until the beginning of the next fall semester/quarter may be used to meet the 24 hour TOPS renewal requirement. However, your renewal GPA, including TOPS Performance and Honors stipend continuation, is determined by your TOPS Cumulative GPA after the Spring Semester/Quarter.
