Students are Programming Robots, Taking Vital Signs, Learning Coding, and Building Computers at Louisiana GEAR UP Summer Learning Camps

"These camps are great because I am learning more about where I want my future to go," explained Louisiana GEAR UP student Lekeitron Young as he recounted his experiences at both Grambling State University's Pathways to College SUCCESS Summer Learning Camp and Louisiana Tech University's Demystifying the Computer Summer Learning Camp. At Pathways to College SUCCESS, Lekeitron and his fellow campers spent a week taking academic classes focused on STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) as well as job shadowing business professionals at local businesses which included Coca Cola Bottling Company United, LLC, Franciscan Missionaries of Our Lady (formerly Our Lady of the Lake College), Gulf South Technology Solutions, and East Baton Rouge Parish Emergency Medical Services. Discussing her experience at the Pathways to College SUCCESS Camp, another Louisiana GEAR UP camper, Essence Richard, stated, "I liked the field trip to Franciscan Missionaries of Our Lady because I want to be a Registered Nurse in the future."

During Louisiana Tech University's Demystifying the Computer Summer Learning Camp, students built personal computers using a box of parts before connecting all of their computers to a network to interact and interface with each other. For Owen Meier, an 8th grade student from McKinley Middle Magnet School, the camp provided him with additional readiness for a career in computer science because Owen already has experience building a computer. "I'm thinking about studying computer science. During this camp, I learned some new information, but this is the second computer that I have built. I built the one that I use at home now. I just watched some YouTube videos to learn how to build the computer, and my Dad helped me build it," Owen explained as he waited to connect his computer to the network.

Grambling State University's Pathways to College SUCCESS Summer Learning Camp and Louisiana Tech University's Demystifying the Computer Summer Learning Camp are two of six different Louisiana GEAR UP Summer Learning Camps being offered to Louisiana GEAR UP students this summer.

Through the collaborative efforts of Louisiana GEAR UP with Grambling State University, Junior Achievement of Baton Rouge and Acadiana, Louisiana Tech University, Northwestern State University, and Southwest Louisiana Area Health Education Center, these camps provide students with academic enrichment, critical skills development, and college and career readiness.


