LOSFA/GEAR Up Alumnus Develops Skills Needed for College Success

Since sixth grade, LOSFA/GEAR UP equipped South Central Louisiana Technical College freshman Kenneil Tassin with the knowledge and necessary skills needed to not only get to college, but the tools he needed to be successful while pursuing his degree and beyond.

Tassin's involvement with LOSFA/GEAR UP began after a representative came to his middle school to talk about summer camps, which he attended annually leading up to his senior year of high school.

"The summer camps' objectives were to make us feel more comfortable with the idea of going to college and to make the transition to college easier," Tassin said. "For example, living on campus for one to two weeks made it easier to be away from home."

The 2015 East St. John High School graduate said that, because of LOSFA's/GEAR UP's programs, college became possible not only for him, but also for his peers. "Handing us the idea of college at such a young age was important for all of us," Tassin said.

Tassin has participated in countless seminars, trips, programs and camps sponsored and provided by LOSFA/GEAR UP.

"All in all, my experience with LOSFA gave me a sense of independence," Tassin said. "You feel better about yourself. You feel like you can do it."

Tassin is majoring in business office administration. He said he is pleased so far with his choice because he is

Louisiana College Application Month (LCAM) **Events**



The American College Application Campaign (ACAC), an effort of the American Council on Education (ACE), is a national initiative to increase the number of firstgeneration and low-income


students to pursue a postsecondary education. The purpose is to help high school seniors navigate the college admissions process and to ensure that each participating student submits at least one admissions application.


