LA GEAR UP Conference Set for March 9-11

BATON ROUGE – More than 350 Louisiana GEAR UP students, who will be representing 48 schools and 16 school districts across the state of Louisiana, will converge at the Hilton Baton Rouge Capitol Downtown Hotel from March 9-11 for the Louisiana GEAR UP Conference.

During the conference, the students will rotate through sessions focused on academic preparation and college and career readiness including sessions such as "Medical Magic" and "Chopped." In the "Medical Magic" session, students will visit the Baton Rouge Rehabilitation Hospital to learn about opportunities offered in the medical field from real medical professionals including an Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapist, Registered Nurse, and a Physical Therapist Assistant. During "Chopped," the students will be able to put their culinary skills to the test in a friendly cooking competition while learning about all of the career opportunities offered in the culinary industry.

Conference Highlights

Friday Evening (March 9)

Friday's events will include a welcoming introduction for all attendees. The students will attend a College and Career Fair and participate in activities that test their college and career knowledge during the College and Career Bonanza.

Saturday Morning and Afternoon (March 10)

Saturday's events will include sessions focused on academic preparation and college and career readiness. Students will spend approximately 45 minutes in each session, which will include a variety of off-site and on-site sessions.

Saturday Evening (March 10)

Saturday evening's highlight will be Rip the Career Runway. During Rip the Career Runway, the students will wear clothing related to their career aspirations and walk the runway to showcase their future careers for their fellow Louisiana GEAR UP students to see.

Sunday Morning (March 11)

Sunday morning events will provide students with the opportunity to go more in-depth into college and career readiness by granting them access to career professionals during the Career Speed Networking and postsecondary organizations during the Auxiliary Group Presentations.

One Sunday morning highlight will be the Career Speed Networking Event. The objective is to provide students with career knowledge to promote educated college and career planning. Professionals working

in fields related to their degrees—from cosmetology to law enforcement to engineering—have been recruited to interact with students. Volunteers will staff round tables as small groups of students travel from career table to career table modeled around the speed dating concept.

LA GEAR UP (Louisiana Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs) is administered by the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) and supported by the U.S. Department of Education, which gives grants to states or institutions of higher learning to create partnerships with high-poverty middle or high schools. In partnership with 12 Louisiana parishes, LA GEAR UP aims to increase the number of low-income students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education.
