Attached is the 2009-2010 Tuition and Mandatory Fees chart approved by the Board of Regents to be used when determining GO Grant eligibility for the 2009-2010 academic year. Schools should use this updated information when determining eligibility. For your convenience, this information will also be posted to LOSFA's website at [www.osfa.state.la.us](http://www.osfa.state.la.us).

The intent of the GO Grant is to reduce the cost gap between the aid received by the student and the cost of attendance; thereby reducing the student's need to borrow to attend school. Program intent should be factored into the policy schools develop regarding award distribution. As stated in Bulletin S2009-6 dated May 12, 2009:

Schools will have autonomy relative to award distribution, e.g., first come, first served; priority to incoming students; priority to continuing students; or another method in line with the school's priority order. Schools are required to document the chosen priority/distribution method as a matter of policy and to adhere to the policy in a consistent manner. Documentation of compliance should be sufficiently present for audit purposes.
