

WHAT IS TOPS?

Louisiana's Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) is a comprehensive program of state scholarships and one of the most innovative and progressive student assistance programs in the nation. TOPS has four award components. See the table on the reverse for eligibility and renewal requirements of each award, except the Tech Award, which is presented in a separate brochure.

TOPS CORE CURRICULUM

Students must take the courses required for TOPS within their LA Core 4 curriculum requirements. For more information on Core 4 requirements go to www.doe.louisiana.gov.

HOW AND WHEN TO APPLY FOR TOPS?

To apply for TOPS, the student must complete the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov or the TOPS On-line Application at www.osfa.la.gov. The FAFSA must be completed by students who qualify for federal grant aid, and by students who are seeking other forms of financial aid. The TOPS On-line application may be completed by students who can certify that they do not qualify for federal grant aid. In the event of a budget shortfall, students completing the TOPS On-line Application instead of the FAFSA will be the first to lose their TOPS award.

Graduates of 2010 - You **MUST** have an application receipt date no later than **July 1, 2010** to receive your TOPS award beginning with the upcoming college academic year, 2010-2011. Initial applications received after July 1, 2010 will not be funded until the subsequent college academic year, 2011-2012. Be sure to **PRINT** and **RETAIN** your dated FAFSA confirmation page that includes the confirmation number in case verification of timely filing is required.

* 2010 high school graduates who miss the July 1, 2010 application deadline for TOPS payments during Academic Year 2010-2011 may enroll full time in an eligible college or university at their own expense during that Academic Year and will still be eligible for 8 semesters of TOPS funding beginning in Academic Year 2011-2012 if their application is received by July 1, 2011 AND they have maintained TOPS continuation requirements. 2010 high school graduates may also choose to delay their enrollment in an eligible institution until the 2011-2012 Academic Year and apply by July 1, 2011 for a full 8 semesters of eligibility.
 ** 2010 high school graduates who miss the July 1, 2010 application deadline for TOPS payments during Academic Year 2010-2011 AND the July 1, 2011 application deadline will be eligible for 7 semesters of TOPS funding beginning in Academic Year 2011-2012 if their application is received by Aug. 30, 2011. If they enrolled full time in an eligible college or university during Academic Year 2010-2011, they must have maintained TOPS continuation requirements.
 *** 2010 high school graduates who miss the July 1, 2010 application deadline for TOPS payments during Academic Year 2010-2011 AND the July 1, 2011 application deadline AND the Aug. 30, 2011 deadline will be eligible for 6 semesters of TOPS funding beginning in Academic Year 2011-2012 if their application is received by Oct. 29, 2011. If they enrolled full time in an eligible college or university during Academic Year 2010-2011, they must have maintained TOPS continuation requirements.

NON HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES

Students with superior intellect who enter college full-time prior to their nineteenth birthday without completing high school or an approved home study program may qualify for a TOPS award. Contact LOSFA for more information.

- 1 - Applicable to students who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents who are eligible to apply for U.S. citizenship and who graduate from Louisiana public or approved non-public high schools, and who are the dependent of a parent(s) or a court ordered custodian who is a resident of Louisiana for at least two years prior to the month of the dependent's high school graduation; or a dependent of a member of the Armed Forces who claims Louisiana as his legal residence and has filed Louisiana tax returns or who is stationed in Louisiana and completes a DD Form 2058 to become a legal resident within 180 days of reporting to Louisiana; or is an independent student who has been a resident for at least two years prior to the month of his or her high school graduation; or is a dependent or independent student who actually resides in Louisiana while attending a Louisiana public or approved non-public high school for the period of his or her last two full years of high school culminating in graduation as certified by the high school.
- 2 - Core units may NOT be waived if not offered at the high school attended. It is the student's responsibility to acquire any such course(s) through approved correspondence or distance learning venues. Individual courses may be waived for students with exceptionalities or disabilities that prevent enrollment or successful completion. See reverse side for TOPS Core Curriculum.
- 3 - A qualifying score must be achieved on a National, International, Military or Special ACT or equivalent Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) no later than April 30 in the year of high school graduation. Awards may be reduced if tested after this date. Scores acquired on tests taken after June of the graduating year will not be considered. For an ACT or SAT score to be considered, the student must enter code 1595 on the ACT registration form or code 9019 on the SAT registration form. The score for the writing section is **NOT** included.
- 4 - A qualified student who enlists in the Armed Forces within one year of graduation from high school must enroll in an eligible college within five years of the date of graduation or within one year of separation from active duty, whichever is earlier. The veteran must not have been discharged with an undesirable, bad conduct or dishonorable discharge. A student who meets these requirements and did not previously apply, must file a FAFSA within one year of separation from active duty.
- 5 - Students qualifying for more than one award shall receive the highest award.
- 6 - The academic year begins with the fall semester or term and ends with the spring semester or term. All interim terms and intersessions are included.
- 7 - Exceptions for "first-time freshman", "continuous full-time enrollment and/or 24 hour" requirement may be granted for justifiable cause. Contact LOSFA or go to www.osfa.la.gov (under TOPS forms) for an application.

- 8 - Students who met the academic requirements for a TOPS award and enrolled as a first-time freshman at an out-of-state college or at an eligible in-state college but subsequently enrolled at an eligible out-of-state college may apply for TOPS by submitting the Application to Return from an Out-of-State College no later than July 1st immediately following the academic year during which the student returns and enrolls as a full-time student in an eligible Louisiana college. All supporting documents must be received no later than January 15th following the deadline. The student must have met the renewal requirements for TOPS while enrolled out-of-state and must submit a FAFSA or TOPS On-line Application by the applicable deadline. Students who first enrolled full-time in a Louisiana college and remain in Louisiana through at least the fall semester following the one year anniversary of high school graduation must meet the deadline listed on the reverse side of this brochure. For all other students, the deadline is July 1 following the first semester of enrollment or re-enrollment at an eligible Louisiana college.
- 9 - LAICU schools are those institutions that are members of the Louisiana Association of Independent Colleges and Universities.
- 10 - Tuition varies from institution to institution. Your institution may include fees in your tuition that are not covered by TOPS.
- 11 - Applicable to students who complete a La. Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) approved home-study program at the twelfth grade level and who meet the residency requirements (See Note 1).
- 12 - Applicable to students who graduate from an approved out-of-state high school and who meet the residency requirements (See Note 1). Students who graduate from an approved high school located outside of the United States may also qualify for a TOPS Opportunity Award with an ACT score of 23 or higher, provided a parent(s) of the dependent student was actively engaged in work or other activity on behalf of a Louisiana employer or sponsor and actually lived in Louisiana for at least the 24-months preceding the date the work or activity outside the United States began, and must have remained a Louisiana resident through the date of the student's graduation from high school.
- 13 - Unless the recipient of an award is ineligible for federal grant aid, a FAFSA must be filed annually to be received by the state deadline of July 1.
- 14 - Students who fail to maintain a 3.00 GPA shall revert to the Opportunity Award, provided the minimum GPA for that award has been maintained.
- 15 - Provided that the period of ineligibility did not extend for more than two years.
- 16 - Recipients may pursue academic degrees or technical diplomas or both, but may not exceed the award limit. The award cannot be used at a proprietary or cosmetology school.
- 17 - Any student who successfully completes an academic undergraduate degree in less than the eight semesters of eligibility may qualify to receive any remaining award benefits provided the student enrolls in a postgraduate academic program at an eligible institution and continues to meet all academic and other requirements for continuation of the award.
