- 1. Go to <u>act.org/academy</u>, select "Teacher" and enter your new login information. You will be prompted to create a class. We recommend creating a different class for each subject.
- 2. On the top, you will see a Roster tab. From here, you can invite your students to join your class in a variety of ways, including a one click roster sync with Google Classroom.
- 3. Under the Assignments tab, you will be able to create whole class or personalized assignments for your students. The Lesson Plan tab has a suggested collection of resources for your grade and subject, including quizzes. Each question has a hand-picked video or game attached to it so for each question a student misses, they get the exact remediation they need!
- 4. You can find even more resources under the Resource Library tab. Use the filters to better narrow your search, including searching by specific standards. Feel free to save resources to your Favorites too.

Don't forget to invite parents to ACT Academy so they can see their student's progress! Just click the parent icon next to your students under the Roster tab.

- 5. As your students complete their assignments, you will see their results under the Mastery tab. You'll even see if they watched assigned videos!
