Mr. Taylor joined over 130 students sponsored by 66 non-profit organizations. Attendees came from across the country representing urban, rural, foster, homeless, special needs, and under-represented youth who overcame substantial obstacles to persist through high school and make it to a post-secondary institution. They participated in workshops, panels and breakout sessions aimed at sharing tools and strategies for successfully transitioning into college.



Mr. Taylor is a participant in LOSFA's intensive mentoring program, Aspire to Inspire, which is an initiative led by Mr. Khristopher Hobbs.

You met Mr. Taylor in the April 2016 LOOP. He was featured in the article entitled Community Partnerships Lead to Success.

Mr. Taylor was then a senior at St. Helena College and Career Academy (SHCCA). We are proud to announce that since that time Mr. Taylor has received a full band scholarship to Alcorn University. While we are sad to lose him to the state of Mississippi we are proud of his accomplishments.

At this year's Beating the Odds Summit, the First Lady joined a panel moderated by YouTube personality, Tyler Oakley, U.S. Secretary of Education John B. King, Jr., a current college student, and musical artist Jidenna, who also performed for the students.

The students we serve are our 'True North'. We learn as much from them as we hope they do from us. We are as privileged to know them as we are proud! Keep reading because we've got pictures!!



It's Time for Baton Rouge to Complete to Compete



For the city of Baton Rouge, the challenge is on. In May, the National College Access Network (NCAN) selected Baton Rouge as one of 22 cities to receive the FAFSA Completion Challenge Grant. Each city chosen received up to \$55,000 in grant funding to strengthen urban postsecondary

ecosystems by increasing FAFSA completion among high school seniors. In addition to the grant funding, all of the cities will compete for 3-5 prize awards totaling up to \$300,000. These awards will be allocated based on the cities who showcase the most creativity and innovation, the largest growth rate, and the highest completion rate among all of the cities. Both the grant funds and the monetary prizes are to encourage the cities to increase their FAFSA completion rates by at least 5 percent. LOSFA and its partners, however, have set an even higher completion goal for the city of Baton Rouge. The goal of Baton Rouge's campaign, Complete to Compete, is to increase the completion rate by 10% for the current year. To do this, the campaign partners will utilize the grant funds to implement innovative and effective initiatives across the city to encourage FAFSA completion.

LOSFA, a program under the Louisiana Board of Regents, will partner with the Louisiana Department of Education, the East Baton Rouge Parish School System, Louisiana Education Loan Authority (LELA), Career Compass, the Baton Rouge Area Chamber of Commerce, and College and Career Transitions Coordinators of Baton Rouge Community College (BRCC). The partners will collaborate to implement programs and initiatives that encourage FAFSA completion in the city of Baton Rouge. The first initiative that will be implemented in the Complete to Compete challenge is a texting

campaign designed to keep students and their parents well-informed. Weekly text messages will be sent out to provide information on deadlines, updates, and events associated with the campaign. In addition to the texting program, media and marketing material will be designed and displayed across the city of Baton Rouge to create awareness of the challenge as well as to encourage participation.

Both the texting and the marketing efforts will be utilized to highlight the events and activities associated with the challenge. First, to further encourage competition and FAFSA completion, high schools in East Baton Rouge Parish will be having their own FAFSA completion competition within Complete to Compete. Schools will compete against each other for prizes ranging from gift cards to pizza parties. Next, within the participating schools, LOSFA and its partners will conduct FAFSA completion workshops utilized to aid students in the various aspects of completing the FAFSA. These workshops will occur throughout Complete to Compete, even during events such as Match and Fit Workshops and Louisiana College Application and Access Month (LCAAM). Also, the partners will collaborate with LSU, Southern University, and BRCC to host FAFSA completion events on college campuses. Not only will students benefit from the campus events by completing the FAFSA, but they will also benefit from the increased exposure to campuses of their prospective college choices. Finally, another notable initiative for Complete to Compete will be FAFSA Fridays, which will be held monthly beginning in October. FAFSA Fridays will be held at public locations such as libraries, hospitals, and state agencies. Parents will be encouraged to attend FAFSA Fridays to complete their portion of the FAFSA and receive assistance from LOSFA or one of its partners.

The FAFSA Completion Challenge Grant and Baton Rouge's Complete to Compete competition are intended to strengthen the ecosystems of urban college campuses across the state. For the city of Baton Rouge as well as all other cities in Louisiana, the

programs will serve as much more. In fact, both the grant and competition will serve as a sign of what is to come for Louisiana: a push to achieve record-setting FAFSA completion rates.
