


## From the Desk of the Executive Director



Responding to the replies has been a team effort. Some students/parents request someone to call them for further information. When this is requested, our Field Outreach Coordinator milers reach out in response.



**TOP Tips for TOPS Eligibility Processing** 

Milers: Team Lead-Ebony Holmes along with Alice Brown, Sharon Chandler, Marc Ellender, Robyn Lively, Deborah Paul, Paula Smith, Gus Wales, Jason Whitworth TOPS Eligibility Processing keeps everyone in LOSFA IT, SG/TOPS and Public Information in track shoes starting in June. I challenged our team to go the extra mile to find a way to:

- Update parents and students regarding the high schools set to process each week;
- Provide information regarding the fastest way to check eligibility status, and
- Provide tips for correcting errors that delay processing.

The most common processing errors include:

#### **Incomplete FAFSA**

- Missing student and/or parent signature
- Incorrect first or last name
- Cannot confirm citizenship status
- Student SSN cannot be verified

#### **Transcript-related issues**

- No parental consent form on file with the high school (public schools only)
- Missing graduation date on the student transcript in the Student Transcript System (STS)
- Uncertified site in the Student Transcript System (public schools only)

#### **Incorrect demographic information**

- Incorrect date of birth on ACT, FAFSA or high school transcript records
- Varied/incorrect spellings of the student name on ACT, FASFA or high school transcript records

#### Missing ACT scores

- Incorrect name
- Incorrect date of birth

#### User error

 Not using the correct Date of Birth format when registering for an Award System account (MM/DD/ YYYY - e.g. 2/28/1992)

LOSFA joined forces with leaders in education and the workforce across the state to form the Louisiana State Team during the Reach Higher Convening: Preparing Students with Work-ready Skills held at the University of Colorado-Colorado Springs, CO.

The convening allowed state teams to discover connections between education and business.

"Many innovative ideas were presented during the convening," said Liz Smith, Baton Rouge Area Chamber Director of Policy and Research.

"It's important because it supports all of the work that's being done to engage both educators and students in more workplace experiences," Smith said.

# White House Convening - Preparing Students with Work-ready Skills (continued)

The Louisiana team agreed to place an emphasis on training counselors about what is happening in the industry. Furthermore, one of their goals is to look deeper at the possibility of developing internships/pre-apprenticeships for high school students.

LOSFA's collaborations with others throughout the state are crucial in continuing to provide and promote college access to Louisiana's youth.

"I think that if we're really going to make a lift in terms of getting kids, parents and educators engaged in the workforce, we have to have as many capable agencies at the table as we can," Smith said. "Having a team of folks from all over Louisiana working on these different realms is just going to make it so much better for us to be able to do the work well."
