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An Important Message Regarding Louisiana Connect

The Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) has learned that ConnectEdu, the Boston-based vendor responsible for constructing and maintaining the Louisiana Connect College Access and Career Planning portal, filed for reorganization on Monday, April 28.

Users of www.louisianaconnect.org should be aware that while the site will remain accessible, there will be no updates to the data contained therein for the immediate future. However, student data stored in the portal including college searches and comparisons, test scores, academic and service data and other student-entered information will remain accessible, both from the site itself and via the Louisiana Connect mobile application. ACT scores, course completion data and TOPS Core Grade Point Average information in the TOPS Tracker section will continue to display the date of the last update, but will not receive future updates.

As an alternative to the TOPS Tracker feature, graduating high school seniors should log on to the LOSFA homepage, www.osfa.la.gov, click on the Louisiana Award System tab and follow the instructions to create

an account. Once a completed FAFSA is received for the student and matched with an ACT score, the account will be created. As final grade data is received, it will also populate the student's Louisiana Award System account. The first TOPS processing eligibility run for 2014 graduates will occur on the night of June 6. Those students determined eligible at that time will have their status reflected on their Louisiana Award System account on Friday, June 7. Additional eligibility runs will occur every Thursday night so students should continue to check their account for updates.

"We sincerely regret any inconvenience this unfortunate occurrence may present for student and parent users of Louisiana Connect," said LOSFA Executive Director Dr. Sujuan Boutté. "While the future of the Louisiana Connect portal in its current incarnation is uncertain at this time, please be assured that LOSFA will use the summer months to ensure that the most critical student-centric features, including the TOPS Tracker and college cost calculators, will remain available through incorporation into the LOSFA website or another appropriate platform," she concluded.

START Attends Baby Grand Event

New and expecting parents learned about the START Saving program at the Woman's Hospital Baby Grand event in Baton Rouge on May 3. Members of LOSFA's Public Information and Communications (PIC) outreach team (including START Mascot, Earl E. START Saving Program Sets Facebook Chat for 5/29

The Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) will observe national "5-29 Day" at night with its second annual "5-29 Day Facebook Chat" on Thursday, May 29 (5-29), from 6-9 p.m.

The "5-29" in "5-29 Day" refers to section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code which authorizes states to offer college saving plans that include substantial federal and state tax exemptions and other beneficial incentives to save. Louisiana's 529 plan is called the Student Tuition Assistance and Revenue Trust (START) saving program.

To participate in the online START Saving Plan Facebook Chat, Facebook users need to first "like" LOSFA's page. After doing so, questions may be submitted on the LOSFA page. LOSFA staff will be online to answer all questions as they are posted.

LATTA Publishes START Saving Plan Interest Rates for 2013 Deposits

At its April 22 meeting, the Executive Committee of the Louisiana Tuition Trust Authority (LATTA) amended its program rules to publish certain START Saving program interest rates for deposits made during 2013 as determined by the State Treasurer.

The LATTA published an interest rate of 2.168% for START deposits made to the Louisiana Principal Protection Fund Option and an interest rate of 1.715% on accrued Earnings Enhancements for qualifying START investment options.

Deposits made to the Louisiana Principal Protection Fund Option are managed by the State Treasurer's Office and are invested in fixed earnings. The redemption value is guaranteed by the state and no administrative fees or investment management fees are charged for Louisiana Principal Protection Fund deposits.

Earnings Enhancements represent the state matching funds of 2% to 14% paid annually based on prior year adjusted gross income and Account Owner Category. The balance, as of December 31, 2013, of all Earnings Enhancements accrued since the account was opened earned the additional 1.715% interest rate.

START also offers a number of variable earnings investment plan options that are managed by The Vanguard Group. The START Saving program is charged an investment management fee on monies invested in these options. It is possible that monies invested in variable earnings will lose value and investment returns are not guaranteed.
